

The agent Liv Grannes

An exhibition about women, war and love.

With courage and care, the northern girl Liv Grannes participated in the dangerous resistance work during World War II. In this exhibition you will get insight on her life in Mosjøen before and during the German occupation. You get to go with Liv to work at the police station and see the illegal activities she was doing there. We follow her through the war in Mosjøen and London, before returning to Norway again and marrying one of Norway's great war heroes, Jens Christian Hauge.

Many questions are raised when one sees what risks Liv took during these years. These are some of the questions we try to answer in the exhibition:

- Why did Liv and her family choose to engage in the resistance?
- What role did the women play in the resistance?
- Why did it take over 50 years for women's war stories to be told?


















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
