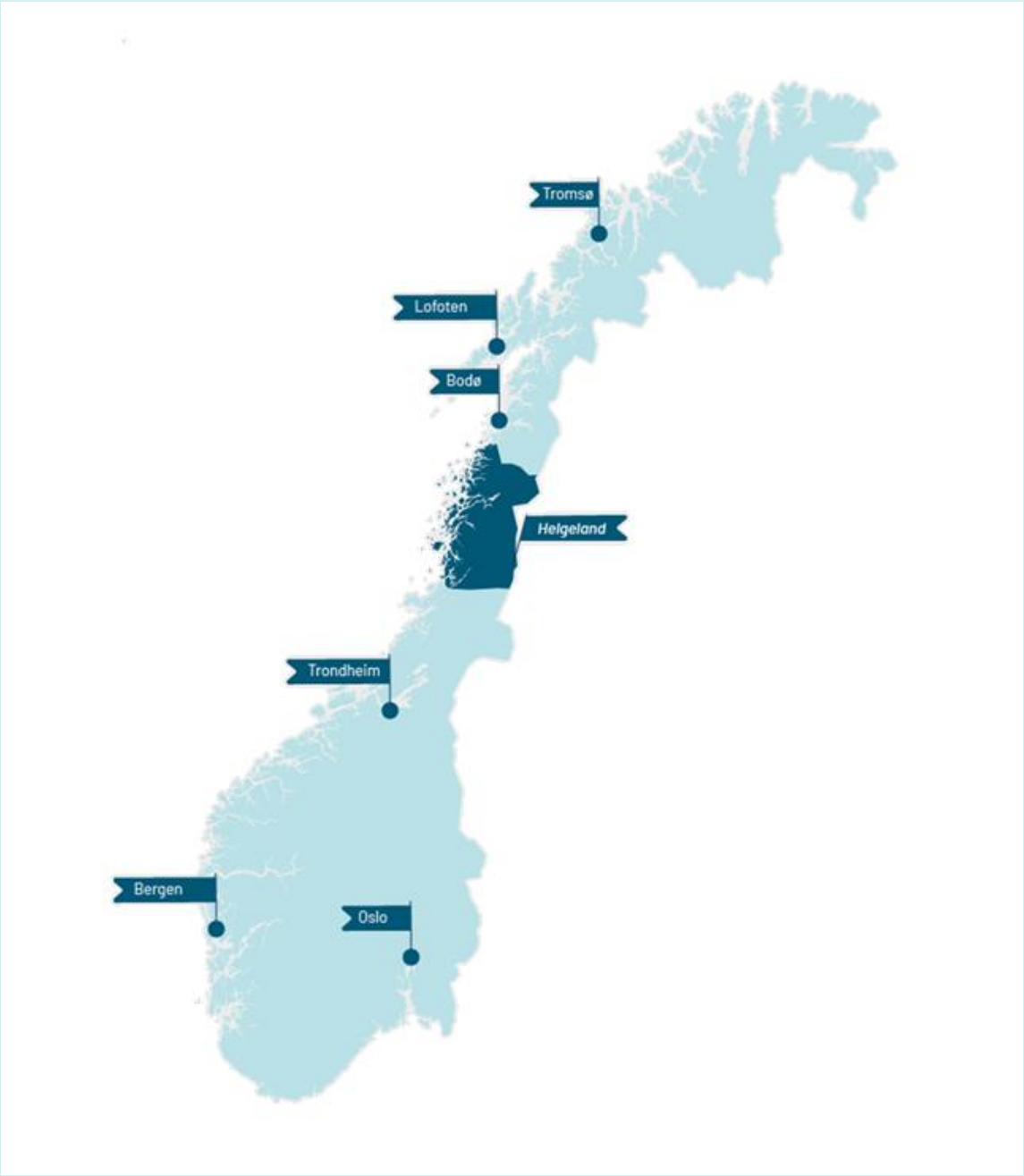

- 19 municipalities, with Visit Helgeland as its tourist board

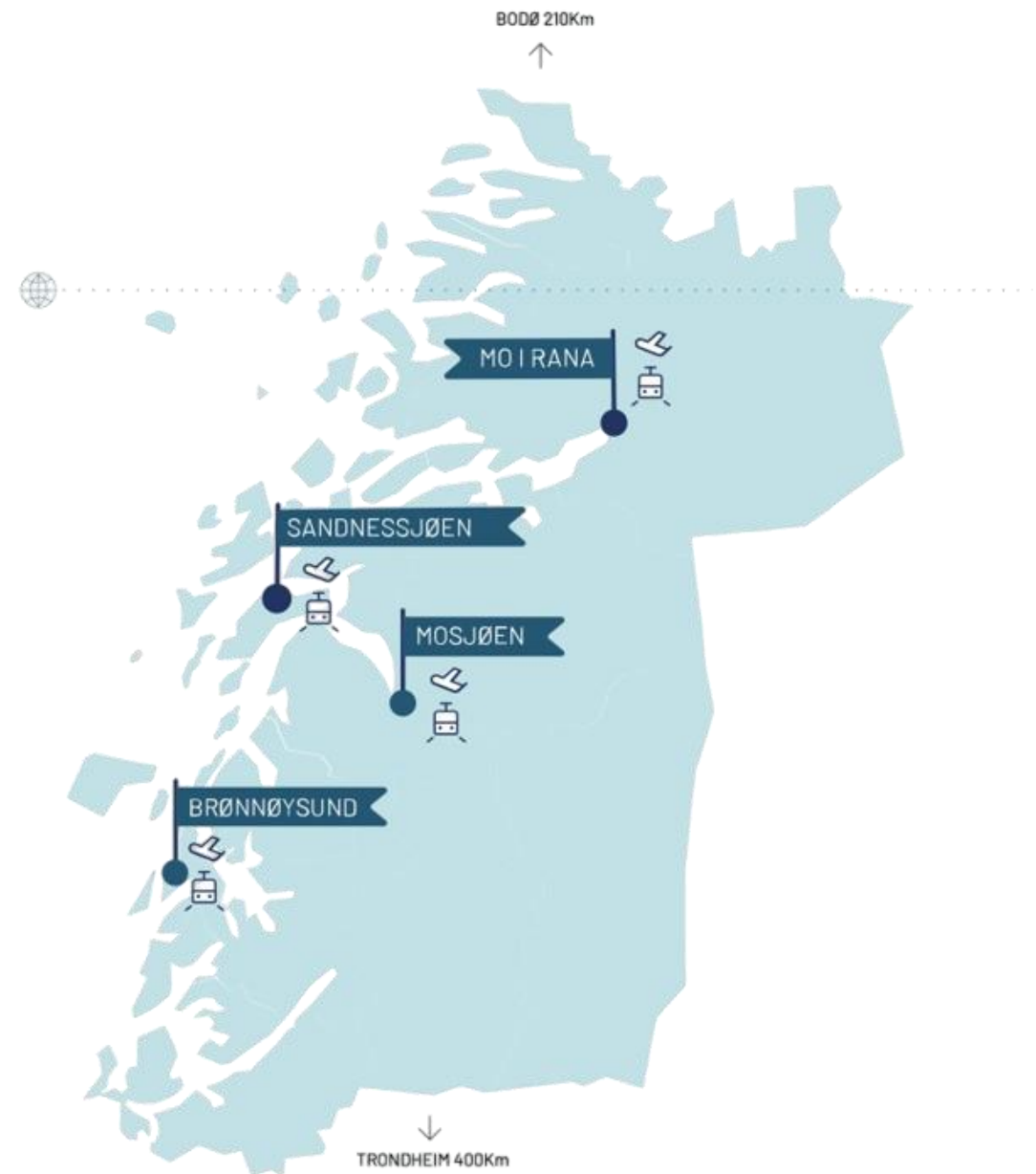

- Wide range of winter acitivities

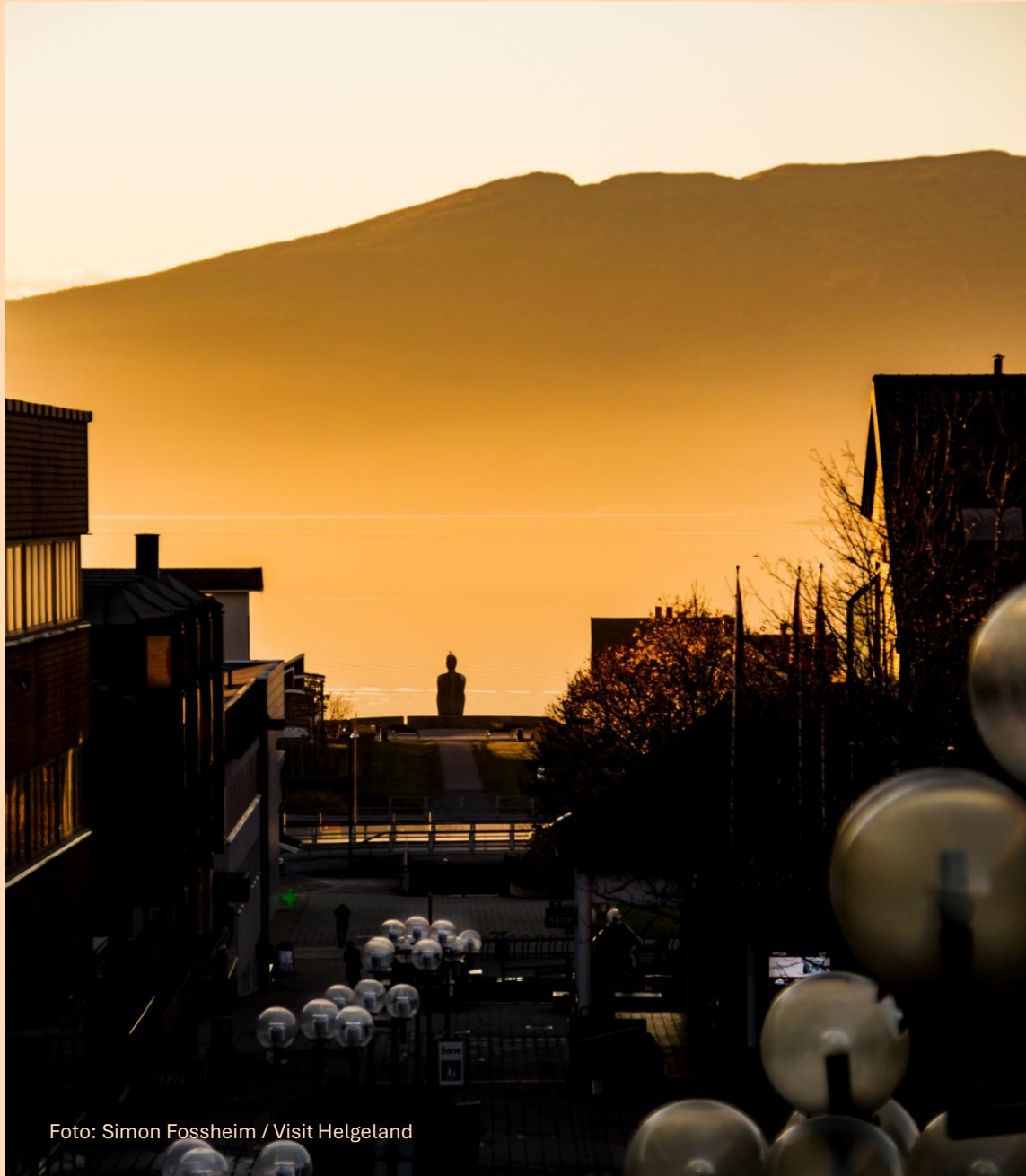

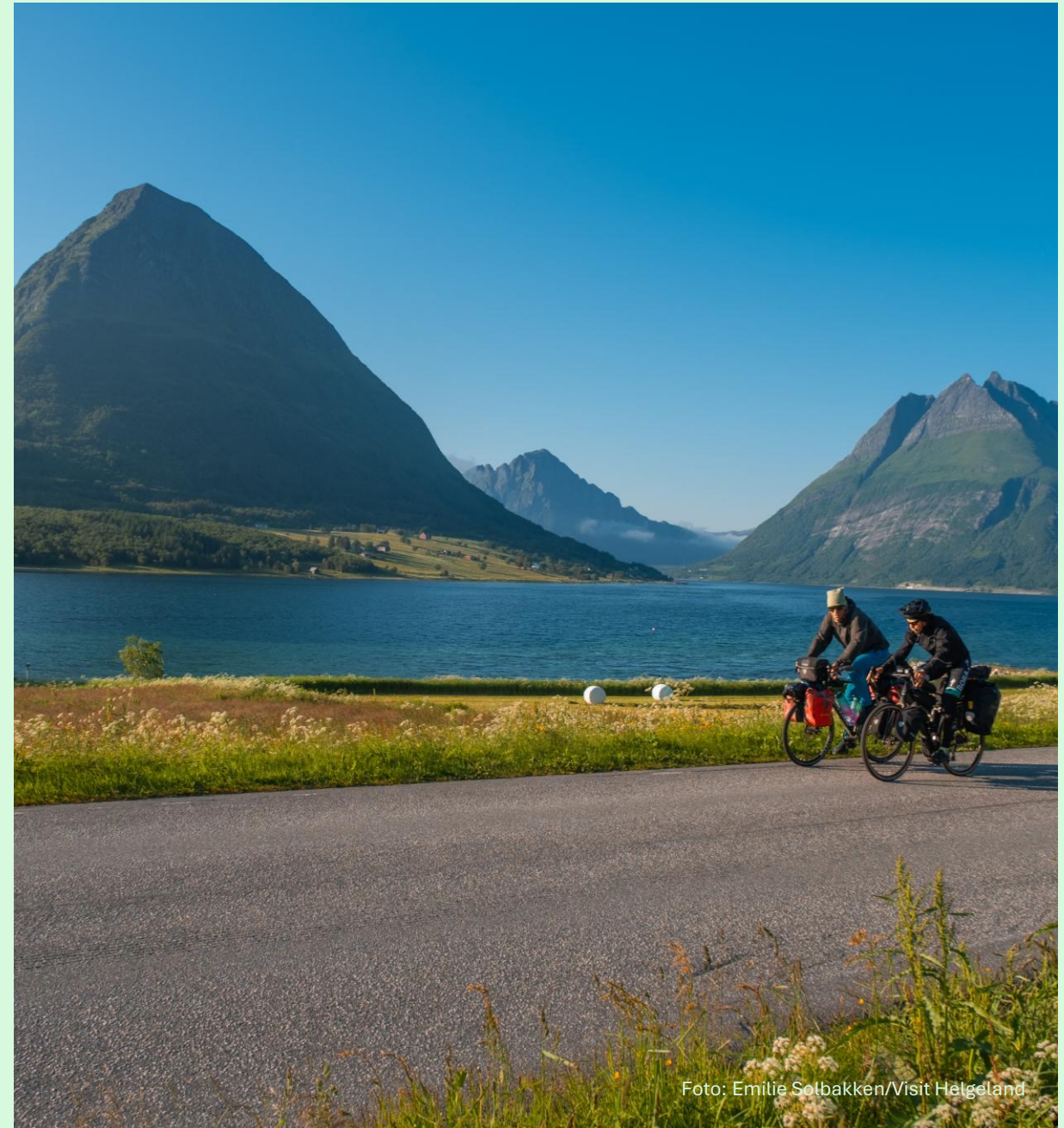

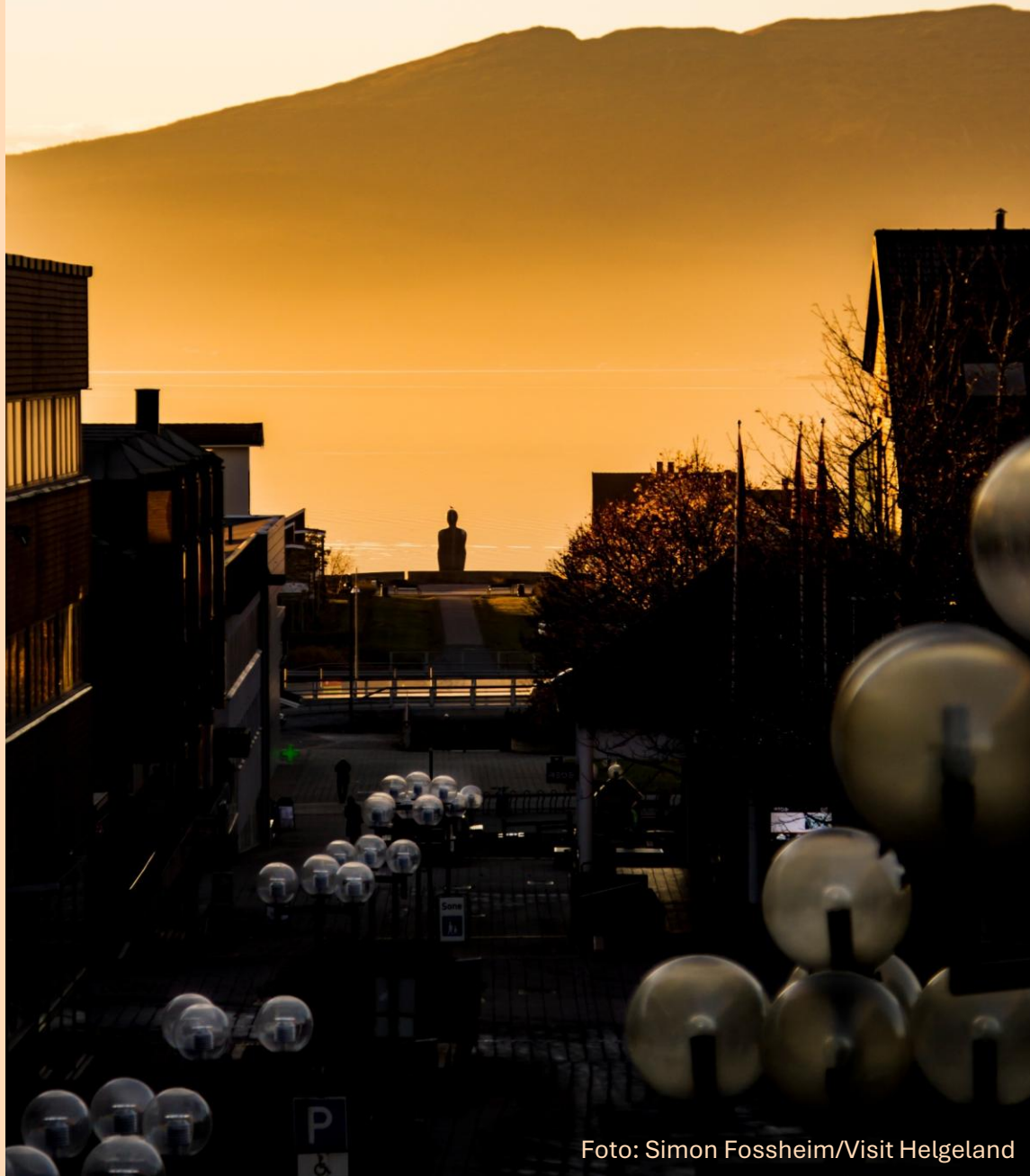
